Marrakesh

One of Morocco's imperial cities, Marrakesh is still considered to be the country's capital of culture. Its ocher buildings and medieval sights like squares, mosques, palaces and gardens draw visitors from the world over. The mixed influences of Berbers, Arabs, Spanish, and French have created a unique ambiance that you can still feel when exploring the city.



Casablanca

The Atlantic port city of Casablanca is the commercial hub of Morocco, but there's much more. It is home to one of the world's most spectacular mosques — the striking Hassan II Mosque, and an abundance of art deco buildings, the legacy of the French colonial rule. Besides, visitors can experience the city's burgeoning art scenes, and stroll along the lively corniche.



Fes

The oldest of Morocco's imperial cities,
Fes once attracted scholars, imams and
intellectuals. Today, it remains an important center of culture and spirituality and a
fascinating place to go. Here you can
discover the world's largest living medieval medina in the city center, walled and
car-free. Inside is a maze of narrow, meandering streets leading to hidden gems
including souks, mosques, and tanneries.



Chefchaouen

Chefchaouen, Morocco's "Blue City", is nestled in the Rif Mountains. It is most famous for its blue-washed houses and cobbled streets against the breathtaking mountain scenery. Explore its quaint craft markets, sit at a street-side café, or simply wander through the streets at your own pace to absorb the unique ambiance.


Visit the Tanneries of Fez


Ride a Camel in the Sahara Desert

Day by Day Itinerary:

Day 1 Arrival, Casablanca

Upon your arrival in Casablanca, transfer to your hotel. Then, set off for the architectural and historical landmark of Casablanca - the Hassan II Mosque, built in the mid-1980s. It is the largest mosque in Morocco and world's 3rd largest mosque.

Day 2 Casablanca - Rabat - Fez (B)

Head to Rabat, one of the four imperial cities and present-day capital of Morocco. First visit the Mausoleum of Mohammed V and the 12th-century Hassan Tower. Continue to the **Kasbah of the Udayas**, you can discover the rich history of Morocco in this UNESCO World Heritage Site and walk through the streets with white and blue-washed walls to feel the romantic and relaxing ambiance. After that, depart for Fez.

Day 3 Medina of Fez (B)

Today, have a panorama view of Fez, the oldest of the imperial cities. Dazzling wares and shops, narrow and winding streets, traditional tanneries and potteries, you can find a lot of fun in this world's largest Medina of Fez. Your guide will escort you and tell you the history and culture of Fez at your request.

After the visit to the **King's Palace**, have some free time in the afternoon. Shopping for some local souvenirs may be a great choice, or you could continue to explore this charming city on your own.

Day 4 Fez - Volubilis - Moulay Idriss -Meknes - Fez (B)

Set off to the Roman Ruins of Volubilis, one of Morocco's best-preserved and partly excavated Roman city. Next, visit another historic ruin - Moulay Idriss, the holiest city of Morocco.

After lunch, head for your third imperial city -**Meknes**. With relatively few tourists, Meknes provides a better experience to interact with locals and feel an authentic Moroccan lifestyle. Afterward, drive back to Fez.

Day 5 Fez - The Atlas Mountains - Erfoud (B, D)

Today, take a long drive to **Erfoud**. The attractions along the way won't let you down. You will ascend the Middle Atlas **Mountains** through a forest of cedar trees, and travel past **Ifrane**, a nice ski resort town with a European flavor. Then, have lunch in Midelt, a small town with a great view of the Eastern High Atlas.

Continue to the **Ziz Valley** and the **Tafilalt** oases where you could see dense palm trees. Later, you will arrive at Erfoud, a popular movie location, and the most important is that you are closer to the desert adventure in your dream.

Day 6 Erfoud - Merzouga (Sahara Desert Tour) (B, D)

Today, admire and experience the majestic







Sahara Desert. First, visit the goat hair tent to know how the nomads live in the desert. Afterward get a chance to learn about the Gnawa people and enjoy Gnawa music. In the afternoon, head for the sea of sand of Merzouga and go deep into the fascinating Sahara Desert by a 4-wheel drive vehicle. Continue to take a camel trekking across the sand dunes to the oasis. En route, the light of the setting sun will create a golden world with endless sand dunes for you. If you prefer, stay overnight in a Berber tent to experience the romantic starry night.

Day 7 Merzouga - Tinerhir - Ouarzazate (B)

Rise early and climb up to a dune, a good place to feel the silence of the desert and capture the spectacular sunrise. Then, transfer to the **Dades Gorge** at Tinerhir, renowned for lush palm trees and Jewish quarter. You will pass by the **Todra Gorge**, recognized as one of world's most spectacular canyons, with sheer cliffs 300 meters high and a just 20-meter-wide mouth. Transfer to Ouarzazate for overnight.

Day 8 Ouarzazate - Marrakech (B)

Set off for the **Ksar of Ait Ben Haddou**, a UNESCO World Heritage site that you may have seen many times in some famous movies, like Gladiator, Game of Thrones and Black Hawk Down. You can overlook the splendid valley surrounded by a river while walking along the path of the castle. After

that, leave for Marrakech.

Day 9 Marrakech (B)

Start your city sightseeing from the brilliant **Bahia Palace** to the **Saadian Tombs**. After lunch, visit the **Koutoubia** Mosque and take a leisurely stroll around its garden. Continue to the fabulous square of Morocco - the **Jemaa el-Fnaa**, full of various shops, wares, restaurants, food and performers. Find a seat and order a cup of traditional mint tea is highly suggested for you to enjoy the spectacle.

Day by Day Itinerary:

Day 1 Arrival, Casablanca

Welcome to Morocco! Once your flight lands in Casablanca, your private English-speaking driver is waiting at the exit. After a warm greeting, you will be transferred to the hotel. Check into the hotel and enjoy some free time.



Day 2 Casablanca - Rabat (B)

After breakfast, depart for Rabat, the capital of Morocco, with your personal English-speaking driver (acting as a guide as well). You will visit some highlights of this city, including the Royal Palace from the outside, the unfinished Hassan Tower surrounded by two hundred columns, the Oudayas Kasbah combining historical sites with modern architecture, and the Mausoleum of Mohamed V. After the tour, spend some free time exploring souks in the old medina.



Day 3 Rabat - Fez (B)

Check out from your hotel and start your journey to Fez. En route, pay a visit to historical **Meknes**, one of the four Imperial cities in Morocco. Before arriving in Fez, you will have a chance to tour the ruins of Volubilis - the most famous Roman remnant in this country.



Day 4 Fez (B)

The trip today will show you the charm of this ancient imperial city. Start from the old

medina of Fez, and then continue to the Attarine Madrasa, Quaraouiyine Mosque, the Moulay Idriss Mausoleum, the Souk Nejjarine, and the Mellah, a Hebrew district. After the guided tour, Having a relaxing stroll along the narrow alleys on your own will be a good choice.

Day 5 Fez - Erfoud (Sahara) (B, D)

Today, your private driver will escort you to travel through the Middle Atlas Mountain range and the mineral mining city of Midelt on a long drive to Erfoud. You can expect to have a marvelous view of the varied landscape along the way. At Erfoud, take a 4x4 vehicle into the **desert of Merzouga**. You will have a chance to experience camel riding and sand boarding. After enjoying the stunning sunset view, return to Erfoud for overnight.

Day 6 Erfoud - Ouarzazate (B, D)


After breakfast, check out of your hotel and head to the Todra Gorge, where the stunning landscape will catch your camera. Afterward, make a short break at the Skoura - one of Morocco's beautiful oases. Here you might want to take a leisure walk. Continue your journey to **Ouarzazate** and then check into the hotel.

Day 7 Ouarzazate - Marrakech (B)

After breakfast, your private driver will escort you to Marrakech. On the way, make a short



exploration at the breathtaking **Ait Ben Haddou**. It is an ancient fortified village along the former caravan route between the Sahara and Marrakech, listed on the UNESCO World Heritage Sites. After the tour, continue to Marrakech. Check into the hotel and then enjoy some free time.



Day 8 Marrakech (B)

As the fourth largest city and the most important imperial city in Morocco, Marrakech has many attractions waiting for your exploration. The 12th century **Koutoubia Mosque**, the largest mosque in the city, will be your first stop. Continue to the elegant **El-Bahia Palace**, which is set in a two-acre garden with rooms opening onto courtyards. Later, you will visit the **Saadian Tombs**, famous for its beautiful decorations. After your visit to the **Ben Youssef Medersa**, the remaining time is for you to explore the colorful souks at your own pace.
